Language Proficiency

Language Proficiency Requirement

Effective communication with patients, their stakeholders, and interprofessional team members is an essential competency for the practice of opticianry.

As provided for in Section 4 (1)(3) of Ontario Regulation 896/93, it is a requirement for any class of certificate of registration that the applicant must be able to speak and write either English or French with reasonable fluency.

Language Proficiency Criteria

- 1. Applicants who have completed an educational program in opticianry in English or French are considered to have met the requirement for language proficiency.
- 2. If an applicant cannot meet the language proficiency requirement by virtue of their opticianry education, they must demonstrate language proficiency by obtaining the minimum scores in one of the language proficiency tests approved by the College, as follows:
